UNDER GRACE, NOT LAW

“For sin shall not have dominion over you, for you are not under law but under grace . . .” Romans 6:14. Nothing should give the burdened believer more joy than this: we are not under law but under grace. The brutal hand of a law we could not keep has been removed from us by the loving hand of a saving God. We are unworthy and unfit for His marvelous presence, but He has made us worthy through the accomplishments of His Son Jesus Christ.

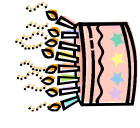
Far from being an encouragement to sin, the fact that we are under grace and not under law, according to Paul, is the highest reason for living for Jesus. Sin shall not have dominion over you, Paul says. Why? Because “we are not under law but under grace.” God’s grace toward us is designed to motivate us, and is able to empower us, to live God’s way. God’s grace demands a response. Our lives should reflect the fact that we have been saved and called by God. Titus 2:11-12 tells us that the grace of God teaches us to live godly lives: *“For the grace of God that brings salvation hath appeared unto all men, teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should soberly, righteously and godly in this present age.”* 2 Timothy 1:9 says God saves and calls us with a holy calling. 1 Peter 1:15 admonishes, *“But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct.”*

This is what we find over and over in the New Testament. God saves, then we serve. God rescues, we respond. God reaches down to us, then we reach up to Him and out to others. Because we are under grace and not under law as the means of justification, that is all the more reason to *“be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in genuine righteousness and holiness.”* Ephesians 4:23-24.

Remember this when you are struggling with your own weakness. You don’t get it together and then come to God; you come to God admitting that you have no hope but His grace. When your sin meets His grace, His grace wins every time. His grace is a million times stronger than your greatest sin. So embrace the grace of God, and then live like someone who has.
