Trades and Forgiveness Andrew Howell

In 2005, a man named Rogers Cadenhead made national news for a website that he purchased. When Pope John Paul II passed away, there was an elaborate process to select the next pope. Cadenhead had a pretty good idea that it would be Benedict XVI who would become the next Pope. So he decided to purchase the website "www.benedictxvi.com" just in case he was correct. Cadenhead predicted correctly and Benedict was named the next Pope.

The Vatican contacted Cadenhead and asked him how much money he would like for the website. Cadenhead said that he didn't want money for it. He said that he wanted to make a trade. He requested to be given a weekend stay in the Vatican, an authentic Pope hat, and to be forgiven for what he did on the third week of March 1987.

It is likely that Rogers Cadenhead was not being serious when he made this very specific forgiveness request. But it isn't too hard to imagine someone desperately seeking forgiveness for something that they have done. All of us have moments and actions we regret that cause us to lose sleep and will weigh on our hearts.

Most people understand that this isn't how forgiveness works. We don't have anything worth trading that would give us forgiveness. That isn't a trade we are able to make. Thankfully, that isn't a trade that we are asked to make.

God makes a trade for us. He offered his Son on the cross so that we may receive forgiveness of our sins.

Paul says in Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

What we deserve for our sins is death. But God offers us a gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. We don't deserve it. We didn't earn it. But God offers it freely to us. We don't have to have anything worthy to trade for forgiveness of our sins. God makes the exchange on our behalf.

We just need to be willing to accept his gift and commit to following him.
